

It will run much the same way as the literacy evening, with different school and divisional staff working at stations and helping parents learn what we do in the classrooms to teach a variety of math concepts. We will once again be serving soup and bannock to those who attend. I hope to see many of you there!

We will have our School and Parent Council meeting October 18 @ 6:30pm. This is a time to learn a bit more about what is happening at the school and ask any questions you may have. Babysitting is provided for those who wish to take advantage of the service. We always welcome new members, so please feel free to join us. Ensuring that Peace River School Division students get to and from school safely is very important to me. Each year, our students and bus drivers take part in safety training to ensure that, if an unfortunate event takes place, every person on the bus remains safe until they arrive either back at home or at one of our schools.

During the last school year, our division had two near misses involving our busses. These near misses happened because people were simply not paying attention to our busses, it is the responsibility of all drivers to know the laws and drive with extreme caution when approaching a school bus, from either direction.

A bus driver will always signal to drivers that the bus will soon stop to load or unload children by activating the overhead alternating AMBER lights. When the bus stops and the driver opens the door, the overhead alternating RED lights and side stop arm are activated. When you see this, it can mean only one thing – there are children either walking onto, or walking off of, a bus. All drivers approaching the bus from either direction must come to a complete stop.

Passing a bus when the red lights are flashing and the side stop arm is activated is both illegal and potentially deadly.

Most of our drivers were trained by one of our three Class 2 Driver Trainers: Amber Johner, Pearl Campbell and Lesli Mitchell. Together, these three women make up phenomenal team with decades of professional driving experience between them.

When a person applies to become a new driver, they only require a Class 5 license because Amber, Pearl or Lesli take care of making sure each new driver is properly trained and can successfully obtain their Class 2 license. This training is always provided by the division at no cost to the applicant.

If driving a school bus sounds interesting to you, then we have a place for you on our team. We are always looking for more bus drivers, both as regular drivers and spare drivers. This rewarding career suits a broad category of people, from stay-at-home parents to grandparents, educational assistants, and so many other types of people with flexible schedules.

At Ecole Springfield, we understand that our students need outside breaks to help them stay focused, healthy and ready to learn. We try to make it outside for each and every recess break we have. 
#### **Rock your Mocs Day**




