## Principal's Message


Happy New Year to our École Springfield Community! It was wonderful seeing all our school family back last week! January is a time to start fresh and watch the magic happen after the first four months of learning!





Students who ride the school bus should also be prepared for winter conditions, should an event occur that they need to stay warm while travelling to and from school.




## First Nations, Metis, Inuit
